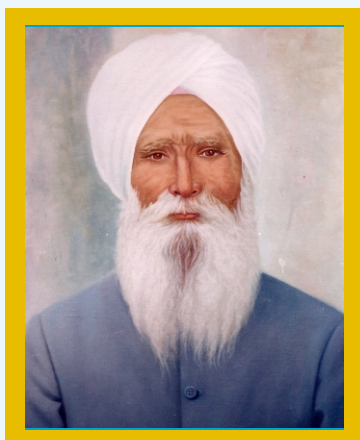

It is often said that status and position of women in society is the best way to understand a civilization, through its progress and short comings. India was no exception to the miserable state of women. It was the time, when some men of exceptional vision and courage took initiative to change the status of women in India.

On May 29, 1909, Bhai Sahib Bhai Narain Singh Ji set up a school in the backyard of his house under the dense shade of a mulberry tree. The school started with four girls whose first students were Bibi Harprakash Kaur, Bibi Bhan Kaur, Bibi Sodh Kaur and Bibi Bhag Kaur. Bhai Sahib Bhai Narain Singh Ji formed a Trust in 1934 and bequeathed all his land and property to that Trust. The name of the Trust was Sri Guru Hargobind Ujagar Hari Trust.

Bibi Harparkash Kaur Ji took over reigns of Trust on August 21, 1944 after the demise of her parents. Khalsa College came into existence in 1950, after six years of death of Bhai Sahib Bhai Narain Singh Ji. Bibi Ram Kaur Ji also passed away on 19th August 1952. After her, Bibi Harprakash Kaur took charge of the existing institutions. In 1953, due to her tireless efforts, J.B.T. classes were started. In 1955, the government approved B.Ed. The establishment of such vast and high-level institutions by Bibi Ji was nothing less than a miracle. In recognition of her special services, the Government of India awarded her with the title of 'Padma Shri'.

GHG Harparkash College of Education for Women commenced in 1955. Shri Hargobind Public School affiliated to CBSE came into existence in 1976. Sikh Girls High School has also become a senior secondary school in 2004. The establishment of the G.H.G. Institute of Law for Women in 2006 was another milestone maintained by the management of this institution. It was converted into a Co-education institution in 2022.

Launched in 1909 with 4 students, this Sidhwan Institute is today educating around 4000 students in the form of six institutes with the establishment of GHG Institute of Pharmacy in 2025. The Law institute fraternity tries to put in its best efforts to realize its mission of value-based job-oriented education.



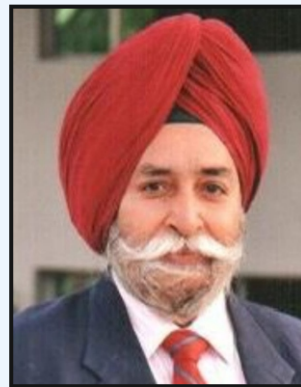

'Bhai Sahib Bhai Narain Singh Ji instituted "Guru Hargobind Ujagar Hari Trust" in 1934 at Sidhwan Khurd to promote the cause of the girl's education and for the management of educational institutions established under it. Bhai Sahib donated his entire property in the name of The Trust. He himself was the first President of the Trust. His daughter, Padma Shri Bibi Harparkash Kaur Ji became the President of the Trust after the demise of her father Bhai Sahib Bhai Narain Singhi Ji on August 21, 1944. S. Mohinder Singh Sidhwan, S. Jagdev Singh Sidhwan, Capt. Dalbara Singh and S. Surjit Singh were the President of the Trust. They all have put their heart and soul to enkindle the light of knowledge and awakening among the ignorant masses. ABOUT THE INSTITUTE

G.H.G. Institute of Law is one of the six educational institutions run by Shri Guru Hargobind Ujagar Hari Trust. The foundation stone of G.H.G Institute of Law was laid down by Padam Bhushan Prof. (Dr.) Khem Singh Gill, former Vice Chancellor, Punjab Agriculture University, Ludhiana on Nineteenth day of December, 2005. The institute is accredited with CGPA of 2.43 by NAAC in 2021. This institute is affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh and approved by Bar Council of India, New Delhi. It started to impart legal education to girl students for LL.B. (3 years) course and B.A.LL.B. (Hons) five years integrated course since 2006.

The Institute decided to impart legal education as a coeducational institute from 2020. Then with the approval of various stake holders viz-a-viz the students, their parents, villagers and our worthy Trust members, Panjab University Chandigarh granted affiliation to the Institute as a co-educational Institute in April 2022.

G.H.G Institute of Law is located in a rural, pollution free, lush green and serene environment under the Jagraon Tehsil at the side of Ludhiana - Ferozepur National Highway. It is easily approachable as it is only 28 kms. from Ludhiana and 8 kms from Jagraon.

Our institute provides best facilities to the students. It has a magnificent two storied building, comprehensive spacious, ventilated and well-furnished AC Class Rooms with ample natural light, sports facilities (Gymnasium), grounds and other facilities like Seminar Hall, Moot Court Hall, Legal Aid Clinic, Legal Literacy Club, Computer Lab with open access wi-fi facility, Enriched Library with E-resources, Hostel for girls, Gurudwara Sahib, Staff Room, Washrooms, Administrative office, Hygienic Cafeteria, and Principal's residence are in the campus and all are optimally utilized. The campus of the institute is under CCTV surveillance along with other security arrangements.

Students of the institute never fail to make the institution proud through the excellent academic records by occupying top positions in Panjab University examinations. The institution also organizes various extra curricular activities for students, staff as well as community.

Students are trained to make optimum use of computer facility to supplement their teaching learning i.e. Power point presentation, Research work, Assignments and Projects. Computer Lab opens during the college hours. Students can access the Labs in their free periods or during break. Faculty members demonstrate the use of technological resources by using it themselves and further students are also motivated to use these resources.

1. LIBRARY

Our institute has an enriched digital library with a collection of more than 5200 books, e-book, journals, online subscribed journals, magazines, newspaper and reference books of law and other general subjects. Library subscribes e-resources like **Live Law, NDLI, SCC Online & Manupatra**. Books are classified according to DDC 19th edition. The library is well-equipped with the latest issues of various Law journals, digests and periodicals along with journals of general subjects. Book Bank in functioning in our college library which provides service to needy and meritorious. The Book Bank has a separate collection of 441 books other than the library books.

2. COMPUTER LAB

In the modern technology driven world, we undertake it as our responsibility to equip our students with adequate computer knowledge. The students are acquainted with application of latest technology in law. Students use the computers to search for new updates in the field of law for the preparation of different competitions, moot courts, projects and assignments.

3. MOOT COURT

Moot court activities are a thrust area of any law institute. Special emphasis and attention is paid by the faculty to ensure the participation of the students in Inter-College, State as well as National and International level Moot Court competitions. Apart from it, every semester Inter-Class Moot Court competitions are also conducted to develop the practical knowledge and speaking skills of the students. The college has also successfully conducted two National Rounds of Moot Court competitions, providing students with valuable exposure to high-level legal advocacy and competitive environments.

4. SEMINAR HALL

The institute has a big fully AC seminar hall with capacity of 300 persons to organise Seminars/Conferences, Workshops, Symposium, FDP's etc. Moreover, the hall is equipped with excellent furniture, a large stage, green room and washroom facilities.

5. SMART CLASS ROOM

A smart classroom is an upgraded classroom that enhances the teaching and learning process for both the teachers and the students by inculcating audio, video, animations, images, multimedia etc. The main highlight of the Smart class room of the institute is an Interactive Flat Panel. Interactive flat panel is a step



beyond interactive whiteboards, large-format touch screen display ideal for education, meeting rooms and collaborative spaces.

6. GURUDWARA SAHIB

There is a Gurudwara Sahib in the main campus to inculcate moral values among students and to connect them to religion and heritage values. Gurpurabs are celebrated with great fervor and enthusiasm. Every year we inaugurate our session with the blessings of the almighty i.e. with the Paath of Sukhmani Sahib Ji.

7. BANK FACILITY

The Punjab National Bank is functioning in the campus. This bank provides all facilities to college staff as well as to students for salary, fees depositing etc.

8. FULLY WI-FI CAMPUS WITH CCTV SURVEILLANCE

The campus is fully Wi-fi with open access and for security purpose there is 24x7 CCTV surveillance.

9. FULLY AIR-CONDITIONED CAMPUS

The college provides a fully air-conditioned campus to ensure a comfortable and conducive learning environment for students and staff. Classrooms, library, seminar halls, and administrative offices are equipped with modern air-conditioning systems, maintaining an optimal atmosphere throughout the year. This facility enhances concentration, productivity, and overall academic experience, especially during extreme weather conditions.



FACILITIES

1. HOSTEL FACILITY FOR GIRL STUDENTS

The institute provides hostel facilities to outstation girl students. The rooms are large, ventilated and well equipped with required furnitures. Both Air Conditioned, & Desert Cooler rooms are available to the students according to their own choice at very nominal rate. Hostel provides friendly and homely atmosphere. Hostel has a common room with availability of colored T.V. and indoor games facilities etc. Hostel Mess facility is also available for the students.



2. CAFETERIA

Cafeteria is available in the campus. Students spend quality time in the break to enjoy different eatables. Every day different eatable items are served to the students. A CCTV camera is also installed to keep a watch on the activities of the students in the cafeteria. Proper sitting arrangement is also available in the cafeteria.



3. TRANSPORT FACILITY

Sidhwan Group of Educational Institution have its own fleet of buses. Buses are available for the students from the different routes i.e Ludhiana. Mullanpur, Jagraon and adjacent villages.



4. MEDICAL FACILITY

Quick medical facilities with first Aid Box is available for both the staff and the students. The ailing students can get them checked by the resident doctor and get prescribed medicines. A dispensary under the Mata Ram Kaur Ji Charitable Hospital is established, having well qualified Doctor and other staff. Free ambulance facility is also available to carry the patients to the dispensary and nearby hospital.



5. TUTORIAL GROUP

Tutorial groups are constituted with Mentor Mentee ratio of 1:15. The tutorial classes are held once in a week in order to nurture relationship between teacher and students doubt clearance, and also in order to solve grievances of students.

The College has recently successfully completed its first One Week NSS Camp and has also achieved the conversion of its self-financed unit into a regular NSS Unit, marking a significant milestone in its commitment to social service.

8. LEGAL AID CLINIC/LEGAL LITERACY CLUB

Legal aid Clinic and Legal Literacy Club is committed to educate its students and other citizens about their legal rights. Various activities are carried out to spread awareness about legal rights and free legal services in collaboration with DLSA (District Legal Services Authority), Ludhiana. Our students perform many activities to fulfil the objectives of Legal Aid Clinic and Legal literacy Club.

To inculcate creative writing amongst students, the college publishes the college magazine '**Intellect Upsurge**'. It comprises of sections where one finds articles on various subjects and interest. ● Say "No" to Ragging

1. As per the Hon'ble Supreme Court judgement in Vishwa Jagriti Mission v/s Central Government and others (2001) 6 SCC. 577 and again according to direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in University of Kerela v/s. Council, Principal's, Colleges and ors. in Kerala In Slp No. 24295 of 2006 dated 16-05-2007) ragging within or outside any educational institution is strictly prohibited.
2. 'Ragging' means any conduct of any student or students whether by words spoken or written by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student or indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause any more hardship or psychological harm, or to raise fear or apprehension there of in any fresher or any other student
3. The University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi has also taken a stern view of the problem of ragging and has also issued the necessary guidelines to curb the menace of ragging.
4. In accordance to these guidelines our institution maintains a strict zero-tolerance policy against ragging. Every year the students are required to fill anti ragging forms and strict action is taken if students are found indulging in any such activity. We are committed to foster a welcoming, respectful, and secure environment for all students.

● Miscellaneous

- 1) All the documents or certificates as prescribed by the University, for the attestation purpose should be attested or notarized, as the case may be, by the competent authority.
- 2) Disputes, if any, shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the District Courts Ludhiana only.

LIBRARY RULES

- A fine of 2/- per day till completion of seven days and 5/- per day from 8th day onwards will be charged for overdue books. In case, any student has lost or cause damage to any book, he/she has to replace it by new book.
- More demanded books can be converted into reference books.
- Reference books will not be issued.
- Journals/Magazines & Newspapers will be issued only for photocopy.
- Physical stock verification of the college library will be done during summer vacation every year. All the books will be recalled three weeks before the stock taking begins. After stock-taking a report shall be sent to the Principal.
- Before leaving the college, students have to obtain No-Dues Certificate signed from the Librarian.
- **The students are issued books during examination on the payment of security with special permission of the Principal & Library Committee.**

- 1) Admission to the hostel will be done at the beginning of the academic session.
- 2) A student may be refused admission to hostel if her conduct during her earlier stay in hostel was not satisfactory or she was a defaulter.
- 3) A student having any kind of medical problem should inform the authority in-charge before getting admission in the hostel.
- 4) Day scholars are not eligible for admission to the hostel.
- 5) The hostlers will have to abide by the rules and regulations laid down by the Warden /Rector and directions issued by the Principal, Strict disciplinary action including expulsion may be ordered at a short notice and without assigning any reason there of.
- 6) Only those visitors are allowed to meet their wards who possess authentic identity card and whose names written in the visitor's list supplied to the college by the parents /guardian of the students.
- 7) Visitors are not allowed to stay overnight at the hostel premises.
- 8) The leave application will not be accepted until it is signed by the parents guardian.
- 9) Leave from the hostel must invariably be got sanctioned from the hostel Warden/ Principal before leaving the college premises. An entry to this effect should also be made in the register maintained for this purpose.
- 10) No student shall be allowed to travel alone unless it has been specially mentioned by her parents/guardian in the visitor's form.
- 11) Students are expected to stick to the study hours strictly and also observe the timings fixed for meals, games etc.
- 12) Boarders should be properly dressed while going to common room, dining hall or hostel office, failing which it will be considered an offence and a fine may be imposed as decided by the Warden.
- 13) No boarder will do any damage to the hostel property and shall be responsible for the safety of the furniture / other articles given to her. Furniture is not to be removed from one room to another.
- 14) No boarder shall indulge in any amusement that disturbs others.
- 15) Boarders are not allowed to use electric appliances like heater, electric kettle, press etc.
- 16) Boarders are advised not to keep jewelry, excess currency or other valuables with them in hostel. They can open their saving account in the Local Bank attached with the college.
- 17) Boarders can't hold any kind of meeting without the permission of Principal.
- 18) It is compulsory for the boarders to attend all college functions.
- 19) Any student found indulging in taking intoxicants, drugs and any such banned materials shall be expelled straight way from the hostel. They shall not be given admission in hostel in future.
- 20) Any student opening a room breaking the hostel lock or seal or window-panes etc. shall be liable to a minimum fine of Rs. 500/-. In case this kind of conduct is repeated, students will be liable for expulsion from the hostel.
- 21) The Warden should be immediately informed by the room-mate if anyone is ill in the room.

- 22) Before leaving the hostel, every student shall obtain clearance from the Warden and personally hand over the charge of the room and hostel property to the Chowkidar on duty.
- 23) The rents of the hostel can be decreased or increased according to the decision of the management.
- 24) Hostel fee once taken won't be refunded.
- 25) The students are liable to pay the dues till the time they receive in writing from Principal to vacate the hostel.
- 26) In case of non-payment of dues in time or violation of any hostel rule by boarder, the Warden may get her room locked or opened for possession without any liability whatsoever.

No Admit Card for examination will be issued to the resident student unless she/he produces a "No Dues Certificate" from hostel.

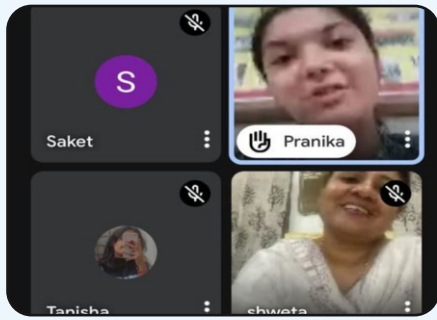
